1	A height safety equipment inspector is to carry out a visual inspection of each item.			Y		
2	Check the snap hooks and karabiners for any damage or deterioration and for correct operation e.g. free from debris, distortion, corrosion, wear, cracking etc.			Y		
3	Check the condition of the webbing and sewing e.g. for any cuts, tears, abrasion, distortion, wear, broken threads or damage from exposure to ultraviolet light, solvents, mildew etc.			Y		
4	Check the D-rings for excessive vertical movement and damage or deterioration. e.g. for wear, cracking, distortion etc.			Y		
5	Check the condition and operation of the chains, buckles and adjusters e.g. for distortion, bent tongues, open rollers, cracks etc.			Y		
6	Check the ropes for any damage or deterioration e.g. for cuts, abrasion, fraying, or damage from exposure to ultraviolet light, solvents, mildew etc.			Y		
7	Record the results in the logbook and submit a customer service report to the FMSP.			Y
