1	Notify the site representative that the service is being done and then set up the portable diesel fuel cleaning and polishing system.				Y	
2	Undertake a visual inspection of the tank and components, check the: a) Tank inspection ports and clean if necessary; b) Tank lids/covers; c) Tank fittings and pipework for any leaks, damage or corrosion; and d) Tank for any leaks.				Y	
3	Measure and record the fuel level in the tank.				Y	
4	Connect the cleaning and polishing inlet and return hoses to the tank.				Y	
5	Undertake a minimum of 3 rotations of the tank diesel fuel through the portable cleaning and polishing system.				Y	
6	Remove the filter (specific to system) from the cleaning and polishing unit every 2000L and inspect for sediment, water, metal etc.				Y	
7	Return to site 2 weeks later and take diesel fuel samples. Notify the site representative and facility manager if there are any issues with the quality of the diesel fuel.				Y	
8	Complete the test sheets and record the results in the log book.				Y
